Maths—Fractions Yr1 - recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts of an object or quantity. Recognise, find and name a quarter as one of four equal parts of an object, shape or quantity. Yr2—The same as Year 1 but they will also learn about 2/4 and 3/4 and the equivalence of 2/4 and 1/2.

<u>Time</u>—Yr1— days of the week, months of the year and telling the time to the hour and half past the hour. Yr2— the same as Year 1 but also telling the time to 5 minutes, including quarter past and quarter to the hour. The children will also learn the number of minutes in an hour and the number of hours in a day.

<u>Statistics</u> — <u>Year 1 and Year 2</u> Interpreting and constructing simple pictograms, tally charts, block diagrams and tables, asking and answering questions about the data.

<u>Shape, space and measure - Mass, capacity</u> and temperature—measuring in grams and kilograms, litres and millilitres. **Position, and movement**—describing movements and turns.
