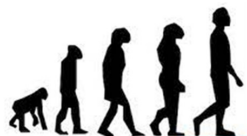

### Science

#### *Evolution*



Evolution	Change over time. It is the reason we have so many species on earth.
Fossils	Fossils are the remains of living things which inhabited the world millions of years ago. They are formed in sedimentary rock (sand, mud and pebbles squashed under layer, after layer over time) and plants/animals get trapped in these layers, revealing their shape.
Adaptation	The process of change by which an organism or species becomes better suited to its environment
Natural Selection	Competition to survive
Variation	Variation is the differences between individuals of the same species.
Offspring	New organisms produced by a living thing.
Environment	All the physical surroundings on Earth are called the environment
Inheritance	When something is passed on to the next generation.

### Geography

#### *North and South America*



Atlantic ocean	Covers 20% of the Earth's surface and lies between the Americas and Europe/Africa
Pacific Ocean	Covers 30% of the Earth's surface and is the largest, deepest ocean on the planet separating the Americas with Asia/Australasia
archipelago	Sea or stretch of water having many islands
Mediterranean	Areas which have mild winters and hot summers
temperate	Non-extreme temperatures, neither too hot or cold
tundra	An Arctic flat plain of land without trees
tropical	Wet and dry seasons, frost-free with high temperatures
great plains	Flat grasslands through central U.S.A between the Rocky Mountains and the Mississippi River
everglades	Tropical wetlands in Southern Florida, U.S.A
native	Original inhabitants of an area

### History

#### *World War II*



Anderson shelter	Half buried in the ground and with earth on top, they protected people from bomb blasts.
blackout	All windows and doors had to be covered at night to stop enemy aircraft seeing house lights.
Blitz	The sustained aerial bombing against Britain by Nazis. Blitz means lightning in German.
Evacuee	Designed to protect people, especially children, by moving them to areas of less risk.
gas mask	Issued to all civilians at the start of the war, gas masks were used to protect from gas attacks.
Kristallnacht	On 9th-10th November 1938, Nazis torched synagogues and vandalised Jewish homes.
Nazis	Adolf Hitler and his Nazi Party controlled Germany between 1933 and 1945.
rations	Ration cards were given out and only a certain amount of food/clothes per family was allowed.
star of David	Jews throughout Europe were forced to wear the star of David to clearly identify themselves.
