As we start the new school year and set our class and school routines, every class is making sure they take some time for reading for pleasure. Our end of day routine now gives every class time to enjoy reading, and hearing a text read to them.

Robins have the opportunity to vote for their end of day book choice from two books selected from the '50 Recommended reads for EYFS' each day. Two titles that have been enjoyed so far are 'Super Duper You' and 'Supertato'

Kingfishers have enjoyed "Troll" by Frances Stckley and Stefano Martinuz, a gently powerful picture book where they met Troll- an underground bully who learns the power of words and empathy.

Owls class text is 'The Last Bear' by Hannah Gold, a novel that tells the story of a young girl named April and her encounter with a lonely polar bear, highlighting themes of kindness, adventure, and environmental awareness.

Red Kites class reader is 'Who Let The Gods Out?', a humorous children's book by Maz Evans that follows the adventures of a young boy named Elliot and a Zodiac goddess named Virgo as they accidentally unleash a wicked daemon.

We began the week with a focus on the word 'Community', what it means to us and what it can look like in action. A game of 'me too!'

revealed that lots of us did have things in common, just like a community where a group of people have something in common like where they live, their beliefs or what they enjoy doing. a building
special?

A church in Kiruna, which is one of Sweden's largest wooden buildings, has been carefully moved 5km to a new location. Many buildings in the city are being relocated because the ground is unstable due to iron ore mining. The church, built in 1912 and voted Sweden's most beautiful pre-1950 building, was slowly transported on special trailers. The process was watched by thousands of people.

The Bible says Christians are part of God's family. Christianity is a spiritual building, with Jesus as the most important stone holding everything together. The teachings of the apostles and prophets are the foundation. Together, Christians are part of a holy temple where God lives by His Spirit. 




