Owl and the joy of Christmas'. We quite quickly spotted that the story was not only following the journey of a rather grumpy owl, but also telling the story of the very first Christmas!



Christingles are used in some Christian churches during the time of Advent. Each part of a Christingle represents something special for



this time of year. Christingles began over three hundred years ago when a bishop in Germany wanted to explain to children the happiness that people feel through knowing Jesus. At his Advent service, the bishop gave all the children a candle with a red ribbon around it as a



symbol of this. In 1968, the Children's Society charity used the idea of the Christingle and made their own version. Reverand Mike and Matt were able to introduce to us a live action version of making a Christingle, what fun!

Reverands Mike and Matt shared the times and dates of our local family friendly Christmas services that everyone is welcome and invited to attend.




## Red Kites trip to Oxford...






